August 17th: Announced Re-launch of #VaxToSchool COVID-19 Vaccine Effort

All New York State mass vaccination sites are open to eligible New Yorkers aged 5 and older, with walk-in vaccination available at all sites on a first-come, first-serve basis for people aged 12 and older. Information on which sites require appointments for children in the 5-11 age group is available on [our website](#). People who prefer to make an appointment at a state-run mass vaccination site can do so on the [Am I Eligible App](#) or by calling [1-833-NYS-4-VAX](#). People may also contact their local health department, pharmacy, doctor or hospital to schedule appointments where vaccines are available or visit [vaccines.gov](#) to find information on vaccine appointments near them.

New Yorkers looking to schedule vaccine appointments for 5-11-year-old children are encouraged to contact their child's pediatrician, family physician, county health departments, Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs), rural health centers, or pharmacies that may be administering the vaccine for this age group. Parents and guardians can visit [vaccines.gov](#), text their ZIP code to 438829, or call 1-800-232-0233 to find nearby locations. Make sure that the provider offers the Pfizer-BioNTechCOVID-19 vaccine, as the other COVID-19 vaccines are not yet authorized for this age group.

All New Yorkers outside of New York City, regardless of income or health insurance coverage who test COVID-19 positive, are eligible to be evaluated for treatment by calling 888-TREAT-NY (888-873-2869) available 24/7 or at the [NYS COVID-19 ExpressCare Therapeutics Access](#) website, which includes a telemedicine visit. The ExpressCare platform allows New Yorkers to receive virtual care from NYC Health + Hospitals providers who have clinical training to prescribe treatment and referrals if needed.

August 31st: NEW CONCEALED CARRY LAWS PASSED IN RESPONSE TO RECKLESS SUPREME COURT DECISION TAKE EFFECT SEPTEMBER 1, 2022

- **Statutory Changes Address U.S. Supreme Court's Decision in New York State Rifle & Pistol Association Inc. v. Bruen**
- **New Requirements for Individuals Seeking to Obtain Concealed Carry Pistol Permits Include Firearm Trainings, In-Person Interview, and Social Media Review, Among Others**
- **Conceal Carry Restrictions Apply to Sensitive Locations Including Times Square, Bars, Libraries, Schools, Government Buildings and Hospitals**
 - **Permit Recertification or Renewal Now Required Every Three Years**
- **State Launches New [Gun Safety Website](#) to Provide the Public, Gun Owners, and Gun Dealers with a Comprehensive, One-Stop Location for Information About the New Laws**

The firearm training requirement applies to all concealed carry permit applicants on or after September 1, 2022 and includes individuals who live in New York City and Nassau, Suffolk and Westchester counties and are required to renew their permits. The 16-hour classroom and two-hour, live-fire firearm safety training course must meet [the state's new minimum standards](#).

The State Police and State Division of Criminal Justice Services also developed [Frequently Asked Questions about the new gun laws](#) for the public, gun owners, and gun dealers.

The [State Department of Environmental Conservation's website](#) has additional information about how the new laws pertain to hunting and hunting education activities, which include

skeet and trap shooting competitions. These activities continue to be legal under the new laws.

The State Police also is working to implement other requirements that take effect in 2023: establishing state oversight for background checks for firearms (July 1); creating statewide permit and ammunition databases (August 1); and partnering with the state Division of Criminal Justice Services to establish an appeals board to review permit denials and revocations.

September 9th: PROTECTING NEW YORKERS THROUGH IMMUNIZATION: STATE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH UPDATES NEW YORKERS ON POLIO IN NEW YORK STATE

All New Yorkers who are unvaccinated, including children by 2 months of age, those who are pregnant, and people who have not completed their polio vaccine series

previously, should get immunized right away. Unvaccinated New Yorkers or those not up to date with immunizations who live, work, go to school in, or visit Rockland County, Orange County, New York City, Sullivan County, and Nassau County are at the highest risk of contracting paralytic disease.

The inactivated polio vaccine (IPV), the only vaccine available in the United States, is safe, and contains no live virus. It protects 99 – 100 percent of people who get all recommended doses. In accordance with CDC, the polio immunization schedule by age is as follows:

- **All children should get 4 doses of the polio vaccine.** The first dose should be given at 6 weeks through 2 months of age, followed by one dose given at 4 months of age, 6 through 18 months old, and 4 through 6 years old.
- **People starting the polio immunization series after 4 years of age who are unvaccinated or are unsure if they have been immunized should receive a total of 3 doses.**
- **Adults who have only had 1 or 2 doses of the polio vaccine in the past should get the remaining 1 or 2 doses** – it does not matter how long it has been since the earlier doses.
- In addition, adults who live or work in the areas where poliovirus has been detected (Rockland County, Orange County, New York City, Sullivan County, and Nassau County) and don't believe they are vaccinated should get vaccinated.

At this time, the following New Yorkers who have previously completed their polio vaccine series should receive one lifetime booster dose of IPV:

- Individuals who will or might have close contact with a person known or suspected to be infected with poliovirus or such person's household members or other close contacts.
- Healthcare providers working in areas where poliovirus has been detected (Rockland County, Orange County, Sullivan County, New York City, or Nassau County) who might handle specimens that might contain polioviruses or who treat patients who might have polio (e.g., urgent care, emergency department, neurology, virology laboratory workers).
- Individuals with occupational exposure to wastewater can consider a booster.

Polio is a dangerous, debilitating, and life-threatening disease. Spread from person-to-person, poliovirus enters the body through the mouth, usually from hands contaminated with the stool of an infected individual. People can spread the virus even if they do not know they are sick, and asymptomatic spread is a high concern among health officials. According to CDC, 70 percent of people infected with polio experience no symptoms. About 25 percent experience mild or flu-like symptoms that may be mistaken for many other illnesses. About 1 in 100 individuals will develop severe disease, including permanent paralysis. Of those paralyzed, 2-10 percent die when their breathing muscles become immobilized. Based on evidence from earlier polio outbreaks, health officials estimate that for every one case of paralytic polio observed, there may be hundreds of other people infected.

There is no cure for polio, but it is preventable through safe and effective vaccination. A core component of CDC's childhood immunization schedule and required by [NYSDOH for all](#)

school-aged children, most children are already vaccinated. New Yorkers who are unsure of their or their child's vaccination status should reach out to a healthcare provider right away. As of August 1, 2022, Rockland County has a polio vaccination rate of 60.34 percent, Orange County has a polio vaccination rate of 58.68 percent, Sullivan County has a polio vaccination rate of 62.33 percent, and Nassau County has a polio vaccination rate of 79.15 percent, compared to the statewide average of 78.96 percent, among children who have received 3 polio immunizations before their second birthday.*

A rate of well over 90 percent is NYSDOH's goal, and every adult and child must be up to date with vaccinations to prevent disease at the individual level. In addition to immunization to prevent disease, New Yorkers should know that handwashing with soap is important, as alcohol-based sanitizers do not work on some types of germs, like polio.

August 19th: NYS OMH Launches Partnership to Help Black New Yorkers Heal from Buffalo Tragedy and Increased Rates of Trauma

The NYS Office of Mental Health is partnering with the Association of Black Psychologists (ABPsi), Inc. to provide specialized “healing circle” support groups for individuals and families traumatized by the racially-motivated mass shooting in Buffalo earlier this year and increased incidents of hate crimes in general. The virtual support groups, known as “Sawubona” provide assistance and support to individuals and families dealing with elevated levels of grief, anxiety and trauma.

The Black-led healing circles, which are non-clinical, provide culturally relevant ways for people to express thoughts, feelings, and stories in a healing way. Culturally grounded in African-centered practices, the model helps address racial and other forms of trauma in communities of color. Updated Messaging: COVID-19 Fall Boosters

On September 1, the CDC announced updated recommendations for Pfizer and Moderna COVID-19 boosters for people age 12 and up. The updated booster dose is a bivalent formula that both boosts immunity against the original coronavirus strain and also protects against the newer Omicron variants that account for most of the current cases.

The CDC recommends that everyone who is eligible stay up-to-date on vaccinations by getting an updated booster dose at least 2 months after their last COVID-19 shot—either since their last booster dose, or since completing their primary series. Pfizer's updated booster shot is authorized for individuals 12 and older, and Moderna's is authorized for adults 18 and older.

As new variants of the virus emerge, updated boosters are intended to provide optimal protection against COVID-19 and address waning vaccine effectiveness over time. In light of the CDC's updated recommendations, we've updated our [Answers to Tough Questions](#) and [booster dose toolkit](#) with new messaging guidance, graphics, and sample social posts in both English and Spanish to help answer questions in your community.

[Severe Respiratory Illnesses Associated with Rhinoviruses and/or Enteroviruses Including EV-D68 – Multistate, 2022](#)

September 9th: Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) during August 2022 about increases in pediatric hospitalizations in patients with severe respiratory illness who also tested positive for rhinovirus (RV) and/or enterovirus (EV). RVs and EVs can have clinically similar presentations and are indistinguishable from one another on multiplex assays often used in clinical settings. Upon further typing, some specimens have been positive for enterovirus D68 (EV-D68). Concurrently, pediatric acute respiratory illness sentinel surveillance sites are reporting a higher proportion of EV-D68 positivity in children who are RV/EV positive compared to previous years. Although it primarily causes acute respiratory illness, EV-D68 has been associated with acute flaccid myelitis (AFM), a rare but serious neurologic complication involving limb weakness.

CDC Recommends the First Updated COVID-19 Booster

September 1st: CDC Director Rochelle P. Walensky, M.D., M.P.H., endorsed the CDC Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices' (ACIP) recommendations for use of updated COVID-19 boosters from Pfizer-BioNTech for people ages 12 years and older and from Moderna for people ages 18 years and older.

HHS Suspends Orders of Free, At-Home COVID-19 Tests — The U.S. Department of Health and Human Resources suspended ordering of free at-home COVID-19 tests after **Friday, September 2**, due to a lack of additional funding to replenish the nation's stockpile of tests.

Preventing Sharps Injuries during Monkeypox Specimen Collection — The use of sharps such as needles, lancets, and scalpels are **not** necessary when collecting specimen samples for monkeypox virus testing. Vigorous swabbing of the surface of a lesion should be adequate to collect enough viral DNA for testing. Unroofing or aspiration of a lesion, which typically requires using a sharp instrument, is not recommended. The risk for sharps injury to healthcare personnel during specimen collection outweighs the potential benefit of enhancing the viral DNA collection and is unlikely to improve the likelihood of an accurate test. Employers should clearly communicate [how to collect lesion specimens](#) to healthcare personnel.

If sharps are needed during other routine care activities for patients with monkeypox, employers should ensure personnel are following [recommended infection prevention and control precautions](#) and [sharps safety practices](#).

Large or Social Gatherings Toolkit for Health Departments — Large gathering and social events are great opportunities for people to connect and enjoy themselves. It's also an important opportunity to provide public health messages to hard-to-reach populations. [This toolkit](#) is designed to help organize events in a safe manner and can be a starting point for conversations between local, state, and federal public health authorities as well as event organizers and business owners.

Clinical Considerations for Monkeypox in Children and Adolescents — While data about monkeypox in children are limited, there is evidence from patients infected with Clade I of

Monkeypox virus that the disease is more likely to be severe in children under 8 years of age. Additionally, anyone with immunocompromising conditions or certain skin conditions, such as eczema, is at risk of severe monkeypox disease.

[These considerations](#) are intended to help U.S. clinicians and health systems develop a plan for managing children and adolescents with exposure to monkeypox, suspected monkeypox, or confirmed monkeypox.
