Dr. McKee is the author of **Hospital City, Health Care Nation: Race, Capital, and the Costs of American Health Care**. He is an expert on health care policy, Medicare, Medicaid, urban policy and industrial policy. His research focuses on how federal policy, especially in the executive branch, plays out at the local level in American communities.
