Exemplary Professional Practice EP10b:

Provide one example, with supporting evidence, when a nurse(s) collaborated with the Nurse
AVP/Nurse Director to evaluate data to meet an operational need (not workforce related).

TIP: The unit-level staffing need may be related to a clinical nurse(s) and/or other types of unit staffing needs; however, the example must demonstrate a clinical nurse(s) collaborated with the Nurse AVP/Nurse Director to address the unit-level staffing need.

Operational Need = an identified gap that inhibits the ability of nurse to work in an efficient and effective manner (equipment, supplies, or time).

Transformational Leadership TL11EO:

- Using the required empirical outcomes (EO) presentation format...Provide one example of an improved outcome, where a clinical nurse(s) used data to advocate for the acquisition of a resource, in support of the care delivery system(s).
- Care delivery system = A system for the delivery of care that delineates the nurses' authority and accountability for clinical decision- making and outcomes. "The care delivery system is integrated with the professional practice model and promotes continuous, consistent, efficient, and accountable delivery of nursing care. The care delivery system is adapted to meet evidence- based practice standards, national patient safety goals, affordable and value- based outcomes, and regulatory requirements. It describes the manner in which care is delivered, the skill set required, the context of care, and the expected outcomes of care" (American Nurses Credentialing Center, 2013, pp. 41-42).
