SE2EOb Professional Organization Participation:

 Provide one example of an improved <u>outcome</u> associated with the application of nursing standards of practice implemented due to a clinical nurse's (s') participating in a nursing professional organization.

Professional organization = "An organization whose members share a professional status, created to deal with issues of concern to the professional group or groups involved" (Mosby, 2017). "Sometimes referred to as a professional association or professional body, [it] exists to advance a particular profession, support the interests of people working in that profession and serve the public good. It facilitates innovation, communication, and connection. A professional organization typically requires member dues, has an elected leadership body, and includes a range of subcommittees or functional areas. Professional organizations can be both national or international, and often have close ties to colleges and universities with degree programs in that field" (Indeed, 2020). For Magnet® purposes, professional organizations set the requirements and standards of practice with the intent of advancing a profession.

Clinical Nurse= The registered nurse who spends the majority (≥51%) of their time providing direct patient care, including APRN's.

SE9EO Professional Development Activity:

 Provide an example of an improved <u>patient outcome</u> associated with knowledge gained from a nurse's (s') participation in a professional development activity.

Professional development= "The activities, such as continuing education, advanced work practice, professional association involvement, teaching, and volunteer work, that credentialed professionals engage in to receive credit for the purpose of maintaining continuing competence and renewing a credential" (Institute for Credentialing Excellence, 2020, p. 15)

Tip: Professional development activities as part of transition to practice are acceptable.
