### **UGCH Strategic Plan**

Over the last several months, the Upstate Golisano Children's Hospital leadership team has been developing a strategic plan for the next few years. This plan was developed based on feedback from team members across UGCH including comments submitted in the survey conducted in December of 2024. This plan does not include all the incredible work we are doing and plan to do, but it is meant to guide us forward and to help us achieve our higher-level goals. ### Magnet Visit Complete!

Upstate Nursing successfully completed a dynamic four-day ANCC Magnet® site visit, hosting 106 sessions and engaging more than 850 team members. We're grateful for the positive feedback from the appraisers, who also noted growth opportunities such as increasing nurse publications and supporting professional memberships and specialty certifications. The ANCC Commission on Magnet Recognition will determine Upstate's second Magnet designation in the coming months, and we remain excited and optimistic as we await their decision.

#### Golisano Children's Alliance

Our namesake, Tom Golisano, made an important announcement this month. There will soon be ten Golisano Children's Hospitals across the country. He also announced that Upstate Golisano Children's Hospital and the others will become part of a new "Golisano Children's Alliance," which "aims to elevate pediatric care by expanding services, strengthening collaboration, and ensuring that children and families have access to the highest-quality medical care close to home."


