- Breakfast 5 to 8 a.m., Lunch 11 a.m. to 2 p.m., Dinner 4 to 8 p.m.



SPS Shine Report

Solutions for Patient Safety (SPS) publishes an annual SHINE Report (Sharing Hospital's Innovations for Network Engagement). This reflects quality data from May 2024 - April 2025. Hospitals are included if submitting (nearly) complete outcomes data, having statistically significant outcome rates or having a 12-month rate of 0 (with minimum denominator criteria).

This year, we were included in the transparency report section for 12-month hospital rate of 0 / hospital center line of 0 for CLABSI (PICU) and Pressure Injury! Full report here.

Turn pot handles in, keep hot drinks out of reach, and keep children away from stoves, ovens, and slow cookers.

Keep small foods like nuts, grapes, and candies away from toddlers. Cut food into safe sizes and supervise young children while they eat.



Pick age-appropriate toys and keep magnets and button batteries out of reach.

In unfamiliar spaces, do a quick scan to ensure medicines, cleaners, firearms, and small objects are up and out of reach.



Keep candles, cords, and decorations out of kids reach, and check lights for damaged wires.

Babies sleep safest on their backs, in their own sleep space, on a firm flat surface with no pillows, blankets or toys. Lithium-ion batteries are used in products like toys, e-scooters, e-bikes, smart phones and computers, and can potentially cause fires. Buy only lab-tested products, charge devices according to instructions, and recycle responsibly.

Gaming program continues to power healing at Upstate Golisano Children's Hospital

Upstate Golisano Children's Hospital's gaming and technology program helps ease anxiety and pain for pediatric patients by bringing video games into the hospital setting. Recently, the program received a \$10,000 grant from BJ's Wholesale Club Foundation, adding to support from Spirit Halloween and Child's Play. Gaming specialist Brad Taylor visits patients daily with consoles and games tailored to their needs, and also uses 3D printing for medical models and adaptive controllers.
